# A Letter from the President

Dear Subscriber:

Once again, the Play Service is delighted to have all of this year's Tony nominees for Best Play. The winner, Simon Stephens' THE CURIOUS INCIDENT OF THE DOG IN THE NIGHT-TIME, based on Mark Haddon's best-selling novel, is a thrilling and emotional journey into the mind of an autistic boy. We acquired Ayad Akhtar's Pulitzer Prizewinning play DISGRACED after its run at Lincoln Center, and we are also publishing his plays THE WHO & THE WHAT and THE INVISIBLE HAND. Robert Askins' subversive, hilarious play HAND TO GOD introduced this young American writer to Broadway, and the Play Service is happy to be his first publisher. Rounding out the nominess are Mike Poulton's dazzling adaptations of Hilary Mantel's WOLF HALL novels. THIS IS OUR YOUTH by Kenneth Lonergan and perennial favorite YOU CAN'T TAKE IT WITH YOU by Kaufman and Hart were nominated for Best Revival of a Play.

We have our 45th Pulitzer Prize winner in the moving, profane, and deeply human BETWEEN RIVERSIDE AND CRAZY, by Stephen Adly Guirgis, which is under option for Broadway production next season. Already slated for Broadway is Mike Bartlett's "future history" play, KING CHARLES III, following its hugely successful production in the West End. Bess Wohl, a writer new to the Play Service, received the Drama Desk Sam Norkin Off-Broadway Award. We have her plays AMERICAN HERO and SMALL MOUTH SOUNDS. Rajiv Joseph's fierce, tender GUARDS AT THE TAJ won the prestigious Laurents/Hatcher Foundation Award.

I'm happy to be able to announce that we now have the professional rights for the plays of Jerome Lawrence and Robert E. Lee, including AUNTIE MAME and INHERIT THE WIND. We also now have the professional rights for the play about everybody's favorite rabbit, Mary Chase's HARVEY. Another "modern classic" acquisition this year is William Luce's tribute to Emily Dickinson, THE BELLE OF AMHERST.

Other notable additions include Tanya Barfield's BRIGHT HALF LIFE, Laura Eason's SEX WITH STRANGERS, Halley Feiffer's I'M GONNA PRAY FOR YOU SO HARD, Joel Drake Johnson's RASHEEDA SPEAKING, Peter Morgan's THE AUDIENCE, Nick Payne's CONSTELLATIONS, and Melissa Ross's NICE GIRL and OF GOOD STOCK. Feiffer, Johnson, and Ross are all writers new to the Play Service.

Our Catalogue index this year has been restructured to make it easier to find the play or musical you want. Please note our discounts, including the recently instituted Educators Discount. If you haven't checked out our website recently, you should! It's better than ever — easy to navigate, with eye-catching graphics and valuable content. Finally, it is appropriate that I note the passing in April of this year of F. He is represented in our catalogue by his adaptations of a number of classic novels. He will be missed.

To order Acting Editions and apply for performance rights, please visit our website at www.dramatists.com. For your convenience, here are some important details about doing business with us:

# **Applying for Performance Rights**

Please apply for performance rights well in advance of your planned production dates to ensure that the play is available for you to produce. All DPS plays are subject to restrictions that may preclude their availability for production. DPS advises you not to hold auditions, begin rehearsals, or make any major production plans before obtaining written permission to proceed.

If your production is within 150 miles of New York City or Los Angeles. please allow extra time for your application to be processed, as special clearances must be obtained in these areas.

Approval for performance of any of our plays is subject to the condition that each play must be presented only as it is published in its DPS Acting Edition, without any changes, additions, or deletions to the text. These restrictions include not changing the titles or settings of the plays or the genders of the characters in any way. Plays must be performed with women playing the roles intended for women and men playing the roles intended for men, unless the author has specified flexible or gender-blind casting possibilities. All terms and conditions for production are listed in your licensing agreement.

All DPS plays are protected under International, Federal, and Common Law Copyright. Any unauthorized performance or use of these plays may constitute an infringement of the copyright and a violation of the law with potentially serious legal consequences for the infringer.

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All orders valued over \$500 must be prepaid, unless you have prior authorization in writing from DPS. Orders shipped outside the U.S. or Canada must be prepaid.

# **Musical Scores**

Complete sets of scores are required for all musical productions. If you apply for and are granted a license to perform a musical, the complete set of scores will be added to your license invoice automatically. Score sets are shipped 8 weeks in advance of your opening date, assuming receipt of the \$400 fees plus shipping and handling. No scores will be shipped until we are in receipt of payment.

Scores must be returned in satisfactory condition no more than 21 days after your closing date. Failure to return the complete set of scores within 21 days will result in forfeit of the \$200 deposit.

Damage and/or loss fees will be deducted from the deposit refund up to \$200. Damage may include markings, stains, tears, missing pages, or any other condition that renders the scores unusable.

When paying for complete score sets, please include a copy of your performance license, or your license or invoice number.

Perusal scores for each title may be rented for 21 days prior to applying for a license. Visit the musical's page on our website to find the perusal score and any other available materials.

#### **American Hero** by Bess Wohl

THE STORY: At a toasted subs franchise in the local mall, three up-and-coming "sandwich artists"—a teenager, a single mom, and a downsized refugee from corporate banking—are perfecting the mustardto-cheese ratio according to the company manual. But when their shot at the American dream is interrupted by a series of strange events, they become unlikely allies in a post-recession world. AMERICAN HERO is a supersized dark comedy about life, liberty, and the pursuit of sandwiches.

# The Apartment Complex — **Seven One-Act Plays** by William Inge, edited by Craig Pospisil

THE STORIES: THE LOVE DEATH. Byron is a successful writer, living alone in a well-decorated apartment, who makes a series of calls to his mother, friends, and the critic who gave his last book of short stories a terrible review to let them know that he is about to commit suicide. (1 man, voices.) THE POWER OF SILENCE. Teachers at the same school, Emma and Louise have been receiving mysterious phone calls, and when Emma answers, no one speaks. Louise is less disturbed by the calls, but they make Emma frantic, and she is sure that one of her students is responsible. After several silent calls, someone rings their door buzzer repeatedly. But who's there? (2 men, 2 women.) MARGARET'S BED. Elsie picks up Ben at the symphony and brings him back to the apartment she shares with Margaret, who is away for the night. Ben assumes that this is a prelude to sex, but truly Elsie is just desperate for Ben to sleep in Margaret's empty bed, because she has a pathological fear of sleeping in an empty apartment. (1 man, 1 woman.) PRODIGAL. Terry is a troubled teen who's been arrested multiple times and is on probation. In fact, if his mother won't let him stay with her, Terry has to turn himself in and go back to "the farm." Nancy has a chance at a new life with a new husband, though, and she can't handle her son anymore. But her decision has dire consequences for others. (1 man, 2 women.) MOVED-IN. The super of the apartment complex, Mr. Flicker, is leaving, and the board has offered his job to Carlton. But Carlton, an African American who struggled to get admitted to the complex in the first place, isn't sure he wants to take the job and give up the hate he feels for many of his fellow tenants. (2 men, 1 woman.) THE KILLING. Mac meets Huey at a bar and brings him home to his apartment to share a bottle of whiskey, but this isn't the kind of pick-up you might think. Mac, who is a religious man and fears damnation, hopes to convince Huey, who does not believe, to kill him. (2 men.) THE TUBE BOOBS. Arch and Clara are a bickering couple and seem to exist on beer and television. Their life together is grimy, bitter, and headed nowhere fast. They are the kind of people who should not have children, but—unfortunately for him—they have a baby boy, who's crying in his crib. (1 man, 1 woman.)

# Ashville by Lucy Thurber

THE STORY: Chronologically the second play in Lucy Thurber's The Hill Town Plays cycle, ASHVILLE is the story of Celia, sixteen years old and trapped in her poor white rural town, among people who can't hope for anything more than a good blue-collar job and a decent marriage. Celia wants something else in life, even if she can't articulate what that is. For a fleeting moment she thinks she finds the unnameable thing in her neighbor and tentative friend Amanda, but it may be that no one else can save Celia—only she herself can orchestrate her escape.

Despite almost trashing it, she's now convinced it's a lost masterpiece by Jackson Pollock worth millions. But when world-class art expert Lionel Percy flies over from New York and arrives at her trailer home in Bakersfield to authenticate the painting, he has no idea what he is about to discover. Inspired by true events, this hilarious and thought-provoking new comedy-drama asks vital questions about what makes art and people truly authentic.

Joe has traveled to New York City from Billings, Montana for a Shriners-like convention and parade, but he is weighed down by his sense of failure and fear of a changing world. He can't even bring himself to stay with his successful actress sister and her husband in their tony apartment, preferring to drag his heavy suitcase to find a hotel room on a low floor. (2 men.) CINDERELLA. This sharp and sly retelling is set in a pretentious middle-class home, somewhere in America. But this young woman seems to have everything in hand to save herself. (4 women.) THE DISPOSAL. Jess was convicted for killing his pregnant wife, and now he sits on death row, awaiting execution today. He alternates between calm acceptance and violent hysteria, raging at his fellow inmates and the prison's chaplain. Jess is desperate for forgiveness from his father, but his father refuses to accept that Jess is guilty, robbing his son of the possibility of some kind of understanding. (8 men, 1 woman.) A HERO OF OUR TIME. Bonnie and Vic are teenage neighbors who have the eye for one another, but their families keep them apart. Bonnie's father worries that his daughter hangs out with bad company. Vic's religious and conservative mother wants her son to steer clear of impure thoughts and deeds. And so the parents condemn their children to lives of dissolution and repression. (4 men, 4 women.) A MURDER. A private man with a box of memories seeks lodging at a strange boarding house—a place where the weather and time itself can change in an instant. When the man discovers the dead body of a young boy in the wardrobe, we wonder if we really have crossed over into another dimension. (2 men, 1 woman.) VENUS IN THERAPY. The owner of a small beauty parlor in a country village, Venus loves to be in love. She seems to be ageless, and it's possible that she really is an embodiment of the goddess of love. But this Venus feels that her lifelong desire has become a curse, and that in the face of sexual obsession, people don't think of love as something real. (6 men, 7 women, doubling.)


