



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THE GREAT AMERICAN TRAILER PARK CHRISTMAS MUSICAL was originally produced by Stages Repertory Theatre (Kenn McLaughlin, Producing Artistic Director) in Houston, Texas, opening on November 13, 2013. It was directed by Kenn McLaughlin; the musical director was Steven Jones; the set design was by Jodi Bobrovsky; the costume design was by Nara Lesser; the lighting design was by Michael Clark; the sound design was by Yezminne Zepeda; the choreography was by Betsy Kelso; and the production stage manager was Sara Hodgin Brossman. CHARACTERS

DARLENE SEWARD, late 20s to late 30s. Darlene is a year-round "Scrooge." She hates everybody and everything all the time and isn't afraid to show it. But underneath her hard exterior is a wounded girl who once believed in true love and Christmas magic. That ended when a terrible accident happened one icy Christmas Eve in another place, another time. But Darlene won't even have to leave the trailer park to get jolted out of her anger and start believing in things again, because Armadillo Acres' heavy-handed use of Christmas lights brings extra-special excess voltage.

RUFUS JETER, late 20s to late 30s. Rufus is best described as a redneck with a heart of gold. Well-liked around the trailer park, he spends most of his downtime fashioning "art" out of found objects. He'll finish off a six-pack as fast as the next guy, but the next guy won't see the artistic potential in the empties that Rufus can. It will take him by surprise when this unique ability extends to his grumpy neighbor Darlene — a woman he usually refers to in words that would land most people on Santa's "other" list.

JACKSON "JACKIE" BOUDREAUX, 40 to 50-something. Jackie is a self-made man and an all-American success story. He took a simple idea and turned it into a thriving local breastaurant chain. Unapologetically capitalistic, Jackie doesn't discriminate — money is money no matter whose pockets it's comin' out of. But Jackie plays to win and he has a possessive side. This comes out when he returns from a business trip to find his girlfriend acting like a completely different person altogether.

BETTY, LIN, and PICKLES are also known as "The Girls." Unlike the rest of the cast, they occasionally break the fourth wall to bond with the audience and help tell the story.

BETTY, 38 to 50-something. Betty has lived at Armadillo Acres for at least 20 years. Part hard-ass, part mother hen, she's the leasing manager at the trailer park and she makes it her business to know everything about everybody who passes through. Betty is rumored to have buried her husband at Armadillo Acres after whacking him a little too hard on the head with a frying pan, so she feels connected to the trailer park in a deep and special way. Of all the Girls, Betty is the most grounded, earthy, and dry-witted.

LINOLEUM, 30s to early 40s. Mostly known as just "Lin," she was formerly a death row wife until the State of Florida flipped the switch on her husband Earl and made her a death row widow. Lin is rumored to have spent time on several

tour buses with famed (and not-so-famed) rockers of the 1980s. That said, her love for her late husband was passionate and steadfast, so she is having some difficulty moving on. Generally speaking, Lin is the fieriest of all the Girls.

DONNA a.k.a. "PICKLES," late teens to early 20s. Donna got the nickname "Pickles" when she became afflicted with a hysterical pregnancy that turned out to be a real pregnancy that resulted in her giving birth to a baby with an entirely different complexion from her husband's. She is now single. New to motherhood, Pickles is often tired, but she still finds energy to embrace the joy of the holiday season. Pickles is a devout believer in Santa Claus and of all the Girls, she is the most airy and wide-eyed.

SETTING

Most of the action in THE GREAT AMERICAN TRAILER PARK CHRIST-MAS MUSICAL takes place at Armadillo Acres, a trailer park in a North Florida town called Starke. There are also excursions to Jackie's breastaurant and the local 99-Cent Store.

In this case, the number would take on a less narrative form, and more of a vaudeville or promo-for-the-breastaurent feel.

ACT ONE

Armadillo Acres is mid-holiday-decorating. A Christmas tree divides two properties — one trailer is on its way to holiday sparkle, the other trailer is bare like the tree itself — one half decorated, the other side bare.

Betty, Lin, and Pickles take a break amidst boxes of tinsel, ornaments, etc., soaking up the sun, drinks in hand.

BETTY.

THE WEATHERMAN SAYS IT'S A HUNDRED AND TWO
BUT THE HUMIDITY DON'T MAKE ME BLUE

BETTY, LIN, and PICKLES. *(Ad lib.)* That is nice / Beautiful day / Gorgeous (etc.) PICKLES.

THOUGH IT'S ONLY THE TWELFTH OF DECEMBER LIN.

WE'RE ON THE LAWN THROWIN' BACK SOME BOOZE BETTY.

THE HEAT AIN'T GONNA KEEP OL' SANTA AWAY LIN.

NO MATTER HOW HIGH THE MERCURY ON CHRISTMAS DAY PICKLES.

PUT OUT YOUR MACARONI MARY AND SPRAY YOUR FAKE SNOW

BETTY, LIN, and PICKLES.

THIS TRAILER PARK CHRISTMAS IS READY TO GO! BELLS GONNA JINGLE, LIGHT UP KRIS KRINGLE

IT'S CHRISTMAS IN MY MOBILE HOME
SET THE HOLIDAY SPAM AND GRANDMA'S BOURBON JAM
PUT UP YOUR FEET, YOU'LL HAVE NO REASON TO ROAM
WE GOT SOME WHITE CASTLE SLIDERS, SPIKE UP THE CIDER
ALL THEM PRESENTS ON CREDIT MAKE MY DOUBLE-WIDE
WIDER

PLUG IN THE FIRE, IT'S CHRISTMAS IN MY MOBILE HOME

BETTY. (Addressing the audience.) Happy holidays and welcome to Armadillo Acres — Starke, Florida's most festive trailer park! Rumor has it, come December, you can see Armadillo Acres from space.

LIN and PICKLES. (Ad lib.) It's true, I saw it on Nova / It's super-sparkle-y (etc.) BETTY. Oh, it's such a magical time! Even the meth lab in Unit 23 is cookin' ham instead of crystal. My name is Betty and I'm the manager around here. Some of you already knew that because it ain't your first time at the trailer park. No use denyin' — I can smell the Boone's Farm from here. But if you are brand new, do not worry — it won't be long before it feels like you're celebratin' Christmas in your own backyard. (Lin comes forward, holding an urn. She also wears a special locket around her neck.)

LIN. Yeah, I'm Lin, but my full name is Linoleum because my mama gave birth to me on the kitchen floor. I'm also a death row widow. Last year, the state fried my husband Earl on account o' his transgressions, so I honor his memory by wearing some of his ashes around my neck. This way he stays close to my ... (Getting emotional.) To my ... To my ...

PICKLES. Tits?

LIN. (Breaks down crying.) Yeah! (As Betty consoles Lin, Pickles comes forward.) PICKLES. I'm Donna but everybody started callin' me "Pickles" on account o' my cravings when I was hysterically pregnant, which turned out to be a real pregnancy that ended with me givin' birth to a baby with a much darker ... complexion than my former husband's. So now I'm not just a new mom ... I'm also a single mom. (Feigns enthusiasm ...) Yay! (... But starts to cry.) I'm tired. Oh ... so ... tired.

BETTY. (Music slows ... Pickles nods off while standing; lets out a snore.) This happens from time to time. (Nudging her awake.) Pickles —

PICKLES. Baby's first Christmas! (Lin tosses a spray of ashes.) Look, y'all — it's snowin'!

BETTY. I think we just lost the back row. (Sings.)

OUR TRAILER PARK FAMILY AIN'T THE TYPICAL KIND LIN.

LIKE ANY MIX BAG OF TRASH, YOU NEVER KNOW WHAT YOU'LL FIND

PICKLES.

DON'T NEED NO FACEBOOK INVITATION OR A FANCY E-VITE

BETTY, LIN, and PICKLES.

ALL ARE WELCOME, LET'S MAKE THIS HOLIDAY A DELIGHT BELLS GONNA JINGLE, LIGHT UP KRIS KRINGLE IT'S CHRISTMAS IN MY MOBILE HOME GO ON A SHOPPIN' SPREE, PULL OUT THE TIN FOIL TREE PUT UP YOUR FEET, YOU'LL HAVE NO REASON TO ROAM WE GOT YOUR THREE WISE STRANGERS, SNOW GLOBE

LIN.

DON'T BE OFFENDED BY MY *STAR WARS* MANGER BETTY.

THAT OUTLET'S IN DANGER

BETTY, LIN, and PICKLES.

CHANGERS

IT'S CHRISTMAS IN MY MOBILE HOME

BETTY. (*To audience.*) Now, I gotta be up-front with y'all. Much as we love the holidays around here, somethin' always seems to go wrong. Everyone'll be all happy and decorating and the next thing you know, the place is crawlin' with psychics and divorce lawyers.

PICKLES. It's the Armadillo Acres Christmas Curse!

BETTY. (Dramatic chord; everything stops, allowing the weight of the "curse" to land.) Be that as it may, I got a feelin' our luck is about to change, because after writing letters and sending photos for fifteen straight years, Mobile Homes & Gardens is finally comin' to Armadillo Acres on Christmas Day! And if we're selected as the best-decorated trailer park in North Florida ...

LIN and PICKLES. Whoa / That's some serious competition (etc.)

BETTY. We can win a \$10,000 cash prize!

LIN. Omygod!

PICKLES. We're rich!!!

BETTY. I swear the whole thing is enough to make me believe Santa Claus might actually exist! (*They all share a chuckle.*)

PICKLES. Wait. (Music out.) Whaddaya mean might actually exist? BETTY.

WE'RE GONNA DECK THEM HALLS

LIN.

JUST LIKE THE NEAREST MALL

PICKLES.

MORE TWINKLIN' LIGHTS THAN THEY GOT AT SEARS

BETTY and LIN.

THAN THEY GOT AT SEARS!

PICKLES.

WE'LL CELEBRATE THE YULE

LIN.

AT THE CHRISTMAS EVE TRACTOR PULL

BETTY, LIN, and PICKLES.

THAT'S A HOLIDAY FAVORITE EVERY YEAR

(Rufus Jeter comes out of one of the almost-decorated trailers. He is best described as a redneck-with-a-heart-of-gold.)

RUFUS.

DECK THE HALLS WITH PLASTIC HOLLY

BETTY, LIN, and PICKLES.

FA LA LA LA LA LA

RUFUS.

'TIS THE SEASON TO BE JOLLY

BETTY, LIN, and PICKLES.

FA LA LA LA LA LA LA

RUFUS.

DON WE NOW OUR POLYESTER APPAREL

BETTY, LIN, and PICKLES.

FA LA LA LA LA LA LA LA

RUFUS.

AND CAROL BRADY SINGS MY FAVORITE CHRISTMAS CAROL BETTY, LIN, and PICKLES.

FA LA LA LA LA LA LA

RUFUS. Hey, y'all!

BETTY, LIN, and PICKLES. Hey, Rufus! (Rufus works on decorations.)

BETTY. That's Rufus Jeter. He holds down a variety of jobs to make ends meet. For example, gas station attendant.

LIN. Pet stylist.

PICKLES. Understudy jouster at Medieval Times.

LIN. Hand model for Stigmata.

BETTY. But he always finds time to help out with the decorating. See, with all these jobs Rufus works, he looks forward to Christmas bein' his one day off. Come to think of it, I think Rufus reflects the spirit and warmth this season brings out in all our hearts. (Music out.)

RUFUS. Christmas, fuck yeah! (Sings.)

DECK THE LAWN WITH LIGHT-UP FLAMINGOS

BETTY, LIN, and PICKLES.

FA LA LA LA LA LA LA

RUFUS.

MIRROR BALLS IN EVERY WINDOW

BETTY, LIN, PICKLES.

FA LA LA LA LA LA LA

(Rufus busts out a keg.)

RUFUS.

TAP THE KEG NOG AND THE FUN BEGINS

BETTY, LIN, and PICKLES.

FA LA LA LA LA LA LA LA

LIN.

OOPS BABY JESUS NEEDS PLUGGED IN

BETTY, LIN, and PICKLES.

FA LA LA LA LA LA

ALL.

WHOA YEAH!

BELLS GONNA JINGLE, LIGHT UP KRIS KRINGLE

IT'S CHRISTMAS IN MY MOBILE HOME

WE'LL CELEBRATE YOUR WAY

RUFUS.

WE'LL BOX ON BOXING DAY

RUFUS, BETTY, LIN, and PICKLES.

PUT UP YOUR FEET, YOU'LL HAVE NO REASON TO ROAM PICKLES.

MY BABY WILL SCORE A KWANZAA AURA

BETTY.

I FINALLY GET A CHANCE TO LIGHT THAT BEER CAN MENORAH

LIN.

LET'S ALL DANCE THE HORA, IT'S

(They dance the hora.)

ALL.

CHRISTMAS IN MY MOBILE CHRISTMAS IN MY MOBILE CHRISTMAS IN MY MOBILE —

(Darlene Seward — the trailer park "Scrooge" — bursts out of the bare trailer, hair a mess, cigarette in mouth, robe/slippers — maybe an anti-Christmas t-shirt. Hag-like.)

DARLENE.
