THE PEOPLE IN THE PICTURE

ACT ONE

Lights up on an old life-sized photo of an acting troupe in Poland in 1935. Moishe Rosenwald, a distinguished-looking tenor; Chayesel Fisher, once a gorgeous leading lady, now playing grandmothers; Chaim Bradovsky, the director, handsome and redheaded; Doovie Feldman, so ancient he's not sure what show he's doing today or any day; and the comedy team of Avram Krinsky, hammy and aging, and Yossie Pinsker, an elfin comic.

PINSKER. Look how full of hope we are.

KRINSKY. A traveling troupe of actors...

CHAYESEL. ... so poor we do our shows in stables...

DOOVIE. ...and use a horse's blanket for a curtain.

CHAIM. So poor but rich with passion for the literature and art of the stage. *Chaim snaps his fingers.*

Places!

As the actors scramble into place, they continue to haggle.

KRINSKY. So poor that when we reenact the siege of Troy we can only afford to use a Trojan Dog.

PINSKER. (Aside.) A Trojan goat would be funnier.

MOISHE. How about, so poor when we do the Yiddish *Moby-Dick*, the whale is played by an anchovy.

DOOVIE. Neither one is so funny. I think...

CHAIM. I said places!

The actors are now in place.

WARSAW GANG.

WE ARE THE WARSAW GANG WE PLAY THE SHTETL CIRCUIT WHICH IS A LOUSY DEAL NO MATTER HOW YOU WORK IT WHY DO WE PLAY IN ANY VILLAGE THAT WILL BOOK US ACTING IN BARNS SO OLD AND COLD WE FREEZE OUR TOOCHAS

BECAUSE WE LIVE ON BREAD AND THEATRE BODY AND SPIRIT MUST BE FED WITHOUT OUR BREAD WE'D JUST BE HUNGRY BUT WITHOUT THEATRE WE'D BE DEAD.

KRINSKY. A company so poor that when Mark Antony makes his famous speech at the funeral of Julius Caesar, he can only afford to say...

Moishe stands in a pool of light.

MOISHE. Friends...

PINSKER. What if he says "Friends, Romans, countrymen. Lend me some money?"

DOOVIE. That stinks.

WARSAW GANG.

TO TOWNS SO BATTERED AND BESIEGED THE FOLKS ARE SKITTISH

WE BRING THE CLASSICS AND DELIVER THEM IN YIDDISH IT'S HARD TO LIGHT UP EYES SO WEARY AND SO HOLLOW HEY! A POGROM IS NOT AN EASY ACT TO FOLLOW.

AND STILL WE LIVE ON BREAD AND THEATRE BODY AND SPIRIT MUST BE FED WITHOUT OUR BREAD WE'D JUST BE HUNGRY BUT WITHOUT THEATRE WE'D BE DEAD.

CHAIM. Kind observers, the illustrious members of our troupe. PINSKER.

CHAYESEL FISHER ONCE MADE LOVE TO STANISLAVSKY CHAYESEL.

ALSO TO CHEKHOV, DOSTOYEVSKY, AND TCHAIKOVSKY KRINSKY and PINSKER. (Spoken.) And me.

PINSKER.

BUT BEAUTY'S FLEETING AND AS YOUTH FLEW BY SHE LOST IT

CHAYESEL.

WHICH IS A BLESSING BECAUSE FRANKLY, I'M EXHAUSTED. MOISHE.

HERE'S DOOVIE FELDMAN WHO PLAYED SHYLOCK, LEAR, AND CAESAR

THOUGH CRITICS SAY THAT HE'S AN ANTIQUATED GEEZER KRINSKY.

WHO CARES HOW OLD HE IS? OUR DOOVIE'S GOT BRAVADO HE'S GREAT IN THAT OLD YIDDISH CLASSIC *THE MIKADO*.

There is the sound of a gong and Doovie bows as the Mikado.

DOOVIE. I was brilliant.

PINSKER.

MOISHE ONCE WAS A CANTOR

WHEN HE SANG KOL NIDRE

EVEN GOYIM SHED A TEAR

WHEN WE CAME TO HIS VILLAGE

AND WALKED BY HIS SHUL WE WERE

OVERJOYED TO HEAR:

MOISHE. (Holding a gorgeous, emotional high G.)

AAAAAAAH!

KRINSKY and PINSKER.

KRINSKY AND PINSKER.

KRINSKY.

HE'S A CLOWN

PINSKER.

HE'S ALWAYS DEADPAN

KRINSKY and PINSKER.

WE'LL BE TOGETHER 'TIL I'M BRINGING HIM A BEDPAN

KRINSKY.

HE MAKES YOU LAUGH.

PINSKER.

THERE'S NO EMOTION HE CAN'T POUR ON.

KRINSKY.

THEY CALL US JEWISH HAMS

PINKSER.

BUT THAT'S AN OXYMORON.

MOISHE.

CHAIM BRADOVSKY WITH RED HAIR AND EYES SO BLUISH HE LOOKS SO GENTILE

YOU CAN HARDLY TELL HE'S JEWISH.

CHAIM.

OUR LEADING LADY SAYS SHE NEEDS ME TO PROTECT HER WARSAW GANG except CHAIM.

HE'S GOT NO TALENT SO WE MADE HIM THE DIRECTOR.

WARSAW GANG.

OH WE JUST LIVE ON BREAD AND THEATRE

BODY AND SPIRIT MUST BE FED

WITHOUT OUR BREAD WE'D JUST BE HUNGRY

BUT WITHOUT THEATRE WE'D BE DEAD.

CHAIM. A mere handful of actors, so skilled they dazzle the impoverished denizens of the muddy little villages with spectacles of heroism, tableaux of ancient and eloquent kings...

MOISHE. Every one of them rewritten by our leading lady, Raisel.

PINSKER. If Shakespeare found out what Raisel did to his plots...he would.

KRINSKY. Shakespeare plotzed years ago.

PINSKER. I guess he found out.

CHAIM.

AS THE YIDDISH SAINT JOAN RAISEL KILLED THEM IN MINSK I CAN STILL HEAR THEM APPLAUD WHO WILL RAISEL PLAY NEXT NOT THE YIDDISHE POPE

Enter on a cloud a bearded God, who pulls down her beard to reveal she is Raisel, a vibrant, lively leading lady.

RAISEL.

NOT ME, I'M PLAYING GOD.

AND HERE'S GOD'S MESSAGE FOR WHAT IT'S WORTH IF YOU CAN MAKE THE PEOPLE LAUGH YOU'LL RULE THE EARTH.

CHAIM. Our leading lady, Raisel Rabinowitz.

Raisel disembarks from the cloud.

RAISEL.

MANKIND IS LIVING ON A PLANET FILLED WITH FIGHTING THAT'S WHY YOUR GOD IS HERE TO DO SOME FAST REWRITING.

WARSAW GANG except RAISEL.

SHE CHANGED *THE TEMPEST* SO IT'S ALL ABOUT NICE WEATHER

RAISEL.

WHEN I REWROTE A DOLL'S HOUSE THEY GOT BACK TOGETHER

MOISHE.

CHEKHOV'S THREE SISTERS GAVE UP MOSCOW FOR CHICAGO

PINSKER.

AND DESDEMONA AND OTHELLO HUGGED IAGO.

RAISEL.

MY *TROJAN WOMEN* HAS NO GREEKS THAT RAPE AND PLUNDER

ANNA KARENINA JUMPS ON THE TRAIN NOT UNDER. GOD KNOWS WE LIVE ON BREAD AND THEATRE

RAISEL, MOISHE, and PINSKER.

BODY AND SPIRIT MUST BE FED

WARSAW GANG.

WITHOUT OUR BREAD WE'D JUST BE HUNGRY BUT WITHOUT THEATRE WE'D BE...

Krinksy has crossed to get a letter.

KRINSKY. Dead. This says, "Actors, there can be no show here today. Dozens of our villagers were murdered last night in the bloodiest pogrom. My own brother, Benny, was lost." And it's signed by Menashe Barofsky.

RAISEL. No. Sweet dear Benny. I remember how much he loved our shows.

Lights up on Doctor Goldblum, a kind young doctor in a white coat looking worriedly at Raisel. The rest of the Warsaw Gang don't see him.

DOCTOR GOLDBLUM. Mrs. Rosenwald.

RAISEL. Especially the Bible stories. When I played Moses's wife and I said...

DOCTOR GOLDBLUM. Do you know where you are?

Once the creator and star of Yiddish musical films in Poland between the wars, Raisel is now a grandmother (Bubbie) in '70s New York. Bubbie longs to tell the stories of her acting troupe's successes and heroism to her granddaughter Jenny. Sadly, her TV comedy-writer daughter, Red, insists on leaving the past behind, unless Bubbie will talk about the events that have plagued them both since Red's childhood.
